Fall term

August 17 to August 28, 2009	Start days for consecutive and fifth-year concurrent education.
August 31, 2009	Lectures begin for Primary Junior (P/J), Intermediate Senior (I/S) consecutive education and fifth-year concurrent education students, fall semester.
September 7, 2009	Labour Day, no lectures.
September 8 to September 9, 2009	Fall semester orientation, first-year students.
September 8 to September 11, 2009	Field Experience I Observation Week for P/J, I/S consecutive education and fifth-year concurrent education students.
September 9, 2009	Deadline for payment of fees, fall semester.
September 10, 2009	Lectures begin, fall semester (includes concurrent education students in years one through four).
September 23, 2009	End of regular registration period; last day to add courses, fall semester. Last day to drop courses and receive a 100 per cent refund of tuition fees, fall semester.
September 30, 2009	Last day to submit online application to graduate for students completing degree requirements at the end of the summer semester.
October 7, 2009	Last day to withdraw from fall semester courses without academic consequences (i.e. without receiving a grade). Courses dropped after this date will be recorded on the academic transcript with a grade of 'W' to indicate withdrawal. Last day to drop courses and receive a 50 per cent refund of tuition fees, fall semester.
October 9, 2009	Field Experience I Observation Day for P/J, I/S consecutive education and fifth-year concurrent education students.
October 12, 2009	Thanksgiving Day, no lectures.
October 13 to October 30, 2009	Field Experience Practicum I for P/J, I/S consecutive education and fifth-year concurrent education students.
November 17, 2009	Last day to withdraw from fall semester courses. As of November 18, 2009 students may not drop courses or withdraw. Active fall semester courses will be graded by instructors.
November 26, 2009	Last day of classes for Bachelor of Education (P/J, I/S consecutive and fifth-year concurrent education) students, fall semester.
November 27, 2009	Field Experience II Observation Day for P/J, I/S consecutive education and fifth-year concurrent education students.
November 30 to December 18, 2009	Field Experience Practicum II for P/J, I/S consecutive and fifth-year concurrent education students.
December 9, 2009	Last day of lectures, fall semester.

January 4, 2010	University re-opens.
January 4 to January 8, 2010	Winter term start days for all consecutive and fifth-year concurrent education students.
January 11, 2010	Lectures begin, winter semester. Deadline for payment of fees, winter semester.
January 22, 2010	End of regular registration period; last day to add courses, winter semester. Last day to drop courses and receive a 100 per cent refund of tuition fees, winter semester.
February 5, 2010	Last day to withdraw from winter semester courses without academic consequences (i.e. without receiving a grade). Courses dropped after this date will be recorded on the academic transcript with a grade of 'W' to indicate withdrawal. Last day to drop courses and receive a 50 per cent refund of tuition fees, winter semester.
February 15, 2010	Family Day, no lectures.
February 15 to February 19, 2010	Midterm break.
February 28, 2010	Last day to submit online application to graduate for the spring session of convocation for students completing degree requirements at the end of the winter term.
March 18, 2010	Lectures end for P/J, I/S consecutive education and fifth-year concurrent education students, winter semester.
March 22 to April 28, 2010	Field Experience Practicum III for P/J, I/S consecutive and fifth-year concurrent education students.
March 24, 2010	Last day to withdraw from winter semester courses. As of March 25, students may not drop courses or withdraw. Active winter semester courses will be graded by instructors.
April 2, 2010	Good Friday, no lectures.
April 16, 2010	Lectures end, winter semester.
April 19 to 30, 2010	Winter semester final examination period. Students are advised not to make commitments during this period (i.e. vacation, travel plans).
May 3 to May 14, 2010	Field experience practicum for first-year concurrent education students.
May 3 to May 21, 2010	Field experience practicum for second-year concurrent education students.

May 14, 2010	Last day to add seven-week spring session courses. Last day to drop seven-week spring session courses and receive a 100 per cent refund of tuition fees.
May 21, 2010	Last day to add courses, 14-week summer semester. Last day to drop 14-week summer semester courses and receive a 100 per cent refund of tuition fees. Last day to withdraw from seven-week spring session courses without academic consequences (i.e. without receiving a grade). Courses dropped after this date will be recorded on the academic transcript with a grade of 'W' to indicate withdrawal. Last day to withdraw from a seven-week spring session course and receive a 50 per cent refund of tuition fees.
May 24, 2010	Victoria Day, no lectures.
June 4, 2010	Spring Convocation.
June 7, 2010	Last day to withdraw from 14-week summer semester courses without academic consequences (i.e. without receiving a grade). Courses dropped after this date will be recorded on the academic transcript with a grade of 'W' to indicate withdrawal. Last day to drop 14-week summer courses and receive a 50 per cent refund of tuition fees.
June 14, 2010	Last day to withdraw from seven-week spring session courses. As of June 15, students may not withdraw, or drop seven-week spring session courses. Active seven-week spring session courses will be graded by instructors.
June 23, 2010	Lectures end, seven-week spring session.
June 24 to June 27, 2010	Spring session final examination period (four days). Students are advised not to make commitments during this period.
June 28 to July 2, 2010	Midterm break, 14-week summer semester.
July 1, 2010	Canada Day, no lectures.
July 5, 2010	Lectures begin, seven-week summer session. Lectures resume, 14-week summer semester.
July 9, 2010	Last day to add courses, seven-week summer session. Last day to drop seven-week summer session courses and receive a 100 per cent refund of tuition fees.
July 16, 2010	Last day to withdraw from seven-week summer session courses without academic consequences (i.e. without receiving a grade). Courses dropped after this date will be recorded on the academic transcript with a grade of 'W' to indicate withdrawal. Last day to drop seven-week summer session courses and receive a 50 per cent refund of tuition fees.
July 26, 2010	Last day to withdraw from 14-week summer semester courses. As of July 27 students may not withdraw or drop 14-week summer semester courses. Active 14-week summer semester courses will be graded by instructors.
August 2, 2010	Civic Holiday, no lectures.

August 6, 2010	Last day to withdraw from seven-week summer session courses. As of August 2, students may not withdraw, or drop seven-week summer session courses. Active seven-week summer session courses will be graded by instructors.
August 18, 2010	Lectures end 14-week summer semester and seven-week summer session.
August 19 to August 22, 2010	Summer semester final examination period (includes seven-week and 14-week courses). Period spans four days inclusive. Students are advised not to make commitments during this period.
