PREPARING YOUR APPLICATION SUBMISSION

1. Choose a program you would like to study from our website at www.uoit.ca.

2. Review the admission requirements and deadlines.

3. Apply online at www.ouac.on.ca.

Complete your online application form through the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC) at www.ouac.on.ca. International students studying at an Ontario secondary school should complete the 101 form. All other international students should complete a 105 form.

4. Send in your application by the deadline date.

You are strongly encouraged to apply by February 2, 2010 to allow sufficient time for your study permit to be processed. Applications will be accepted after this deadline only if space permits.

5. Submit required documents to UOIT.

To complete your application, you must submit the following documentation:

:: Official transcripts from all secondary and post-secondary institutions that you have attended; and

:: Proof of English language proficiency (if applicable).

UOIT will accept documentation submitted by any of the following methods:

:: An original transcript, marks sheets, secondary school diploma, college diploma and/or degree certificate sent directly from each institution in a sealed envelope;

:: Original documents in a sealed envelope presented in person at the Registrar's office; or

:: A notarized photocopy of original documentation. A stamp or seal must appear on the photocopy along with the seal of a Notary Public and the date and information pertaining to the Notary Public (name, title and address).

6. Send in course syllabi for transfer credit assessment (for applicants with relevant post-secondary education).

If you are applying to UOIT as a transfer student, your file will first be assessed for admission into the first year of your program. If you are eligible for admission and accept your offer to UOIT, you may then apply for any applicable transfer credits. To apply for credit, complete the online form using the Transfer Credit Guide that is available at www.uoit.ca/transfercredit.

After you complete the online form, you must also provide the Registrar's office with course syllabi and an official final transcript of any post-secondary courses that you have completed and are seeking credit for. These documents must be in English and outline the textbook, credit hours, course duration, topics and subtopics covered in each course. Notarized photocopies of transcripts will not be accepted for transfer credit evaluation.

All documentation, including the application for transfer credit, must be received by June 1, 2010 for your credits to be evaluated for the full semester. The minimum grade of C (or equivalent) must be received in order to be considered for transfer credit.

AFTER YOU HAVE SUBMITTED YOUR APPLICATION AND DOCUMENTS

1. OUAC acknowledgement.

Once your application has been processed, the OUAC will send you an acknowledgement letter and a student identification number. Please use this number in all communication with UOIT.

2. Accept your offer.

UOIT sends out offers of admission on a rolling basis.

Once you receive your offer letter from UOIT you need to accept your offer on the OUAC website (www.ouac.on.ca) by the deadline specified in the letter and submit your C\$100 non-refundable deposit.

3. Apply for your study permit.

A study permit is required for anyone who wants to study in Canada for six months or more. Study permit applications can take months to be processed so it is important to apply as soon as you have your proof of admission to UOIT. United States citizens can apply for their study permit when they are entering Canada for immediate processing.

Application requirements may vary depending on your country of citizenship. The following documents are required by all study permit applicants:

:: Completed application for a study permit (IMM 1294);

:: Valid passport;

:: Six photos of you and each accompanying family member, meeting the requirements of the photo specifications listed in the study permit guide;

:: Proof of acceptance from UOIT;

:: Fee payment. Please verify acceptable methods of payment with the Visa office responsible for your area;

:: Proof of sufficient funds available; and

:: Any additional documents required by the responsible Visa office.*

*You must also consult the Canadian Embassy, Consulate or High Commission office serving your country or region of residence as each office may have its own additional requirements. Applicants from some countries may also be required to have a medical exam.

4. Apply for residence.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

If you are from a country where English is not the first language of instruction, you must demonstrate English proficiency to be considered for admission. You can demonstrate proficiency by:

1. Successfully completing at least three years of formal, full-time study (no less than three courses per semester) at a secondary or post-secondary institution where the language of instruction and examination is English. **Please note:** The minimum three-year requirement does not include time enrolled in English as a Second Language (ESL) courses.

2. Achieving the required proficiency on one of the English tests listed below:

- :: Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL): 220 (computer-based), 560 (paper-based);

- :: TOEFL Internet-based Test (iBT): 83 to 87 overall (may vary by program); minimum section requirements of listening: 20; reading: 20; speaking: 19; and writing: 20;

- :: Canadian Academic English Language Assessment (CAEL): 70 (with no sub-score below 60);

- :: International English Language Testing System (IELTS): 7; or

- :: Michigan English Language Assessment Battery (MELAB): 85.

ENGLISH FOR ACADEMIC PURPOSES PROGRAM (EAP):

If you have met all the admission requirements for UOIT with the exception of the English language proficiency requirement, you have the opportunity to enrol in the English for Academic Purposes (EAP) program offered on-campus through CultureWorks. A new UOIT partner, CultureWorks has prepared students for university study since 1998. UOIT will extend a conditional acceptance to you, whereby upon successful completion of Level 4 of the CultureWorks EAP program, you can proceed into your university degree program without further testing.

2010-2011 INTERNATIONAL ADMISSION GUIDELINES

The following qualifications are the minimum required for consideration for admission to first entry undergraduate programs. Applicants are required to achieve a high overall standing in their studies and include the appropriate program subject prerequisites with high standing. Candidates are selected on the basis of their academic standing in relation to other candidates. Due to competition, candidates may be required to present averages/grades above the minimum requirements. These admission requirements are subject to change and are to be used as a guideline only.

French-patterned education

(Algeria, Benin, Burkina Faso, Central African Republic, Chad, Comoros, Congo, Cote d'Ivoire, Djibouti, France, French Guiana, Gabon, Madagascar, Mali, Mauritania, Morocco, Niger, Senegal, Togo and Tunisia)

Minimum requirement for admission consideration is completion of the Baccalaureat/Baccalaureat General/ Diplome de Bachelier de l'Enseignement du Second Degre/Option Internationale du Baccalaureat with prerequisites completed in the appropriate subjects. Baccalaureat Technologique from France will also be considered if required subjects are included. Students may be considered in their final year on interim scores.

Latin America

(Argentina, Bolivia, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Mexico, Panama, Paraguay and Uruguay)

Minimum requirement for admission consideration is the Bachillerato/ Bachiller with prerequisites completed in the appropriate subjects. Applicants who have also written university entrance exams should arrange for these results to be sent to UOIT with accompanying interpretive information.

Middle East

(Bahrain, Jordan, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Syria, United Arab Emirates, Yemen)

Minimum requirement for admission consideration is the national secondary school education/leaving certificate with prerequisites completed in the appropriate subjects.

Russian-patterned education

(Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Russia, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan)

Minimum requirement for admission consideration is the Attestat Srednem (polnom) Obshchem Obrazovanii or equivalent with prerequisites completed in the appropriate subjects.

Yugoslavian-patterned education

(Bosnia-Herzegovina, Croatia, Serbia and Montenegro and Slovenia)

Minimum requirement for admission consideration is the Matura/ Secondary School Leaving diploma with prerequisites completed in the appropriate subjects.
